Support of a Water Tax to Fund the loss of Land Equity for Property Owners in the Highlands Region

WHEREAS, The Highlands Water and Protection Act was passed by both houses of the New Jersey Legislature and signed into law on August 10,2004 by Governor James McGreevy; and

WHEREAS, The Highlands Water and Protection Act designated areas to be in the "preservation" or "planning" areas; and

WHEREAS, the Act reads, "The Legislature finds and declares that the national Highlands Region is an area that extends from northwestern Connecticut across the lower Hudson River Valley and northern New Jersey into east Central Pennsylvania; that the national Highlands Region has been recognized as a landscape of special significance by the United States Forest Service; that the New Jersey portion of the national Highlands Region is nearly 800,000 acres, or about 1,250 miles, covering portions of 88 municipalities in seven counties; and

WHEREAS, The Act additionally reads, "The Legislature further finds and declares that the New Jersey Highlands is an essential source of drinking water, providing clean and plentiful drinking water for one-half of the State's population, including communities beyond the New Jersey Highlands, from only 13 percent of the State's land area" and

WHEREAS, the Township of Union, County of Hunterdon is located in both the Preservation and Planning Areas; and

WHEREAS, the value and equity of the land has decreased dramatically for those property owners in the Township and Highlands Act region; and

WHEREAS, the Township also is restricted in bringing economic opportunity, jobs and growth forcing existing taxpayers to pay higher amounts due to lack of growth and smart development; and

WHEREAS, areas located outside of the "Highlands Area" are using highlands resources without paying or compensating those affected communities:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Township Committee of the Township of Franklin, County of Warren, strongly urge the New Jersey State Senate and General Assembly to craft a bill which would charge those who use Highlands Area water to compensate those communities impacted by the Act,

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Township Committee of the Township of Franklin, County of Warren, will forward this resolution to every municipality located within the territory of the Highlands Water and Protective Act Region.

New Jersey State Police – not present

DISCUSSIONS/APPROVALS/EXECUTIONS:

Community Center Update – Eddy Patient attended this meeting and reviewed his report submitted last month with the committee, pertaining to Financials, Revenue, Issues and Proposals. Approximately \$25,000 was brought in last year and this year the winter alone has brought in \$22,000 to date, this revenue is outside the FTYA hours. Presently we have roller

derby, soccer, hockey, tennis, baseball and basketball teams that utilize this facility. At this time, we are running out of storage for equipment that is not being used, season to season, such as goals and they are currently sitting in the spectator area and/or in front of the garage doors causing a fire hazard. Purchase of a container or a pod, for outside of the building, or build out the back, to have access from inside the building, to store unused items, would be helpful. Eddy will provide quotes to the committee for review. Also, looking to expand our website, dedicated to show what we are doing in the Community Center. Eddy will also provide quotes for a wheelchair lift to replace the ramp, which takes up a lot of room in the back. Committeeman DeAngelis commented that when we rent a lift to be certain it is an indoor lift with solid white wheels in lieu of black wheels to ensure no marks left on the floor surface.

Franklin Township Youth Association – Jim Schlessinger, President of the FTYA, was present to discuss possible improvements to the athletic fields, at the school and in Asbury. A 60% growth has been seen in Field Hockey and Soccer is operating in capacity; starting to beat up the fields. A delay in gathering quotes, due to snow this year, will provide for the next meeting. Jim has volunteers to assist with the labor, but, is looking for financial assistance for cost of the material needed to upgrade the fields.

- 3. OU2 Mayor and Engineer met with the EPA, as to the new waterlines in the township, would like to see the roads repaved after this is completed. No objection noted to this by the EPA. EPA still looking for 1 acre for equipment and material, possibly use the land where Sam Santini farms across from Franklin Township School. (near the barns off of Bryant Road).

Rescue Squad - Chief Karen Chiu

Chief Chiu had nothing to report. Mayor Butler addressed the letter received by Chief Chiu in reference to the South Regional Task Force. Chiu commented that she heard of a rumor as to this task force being disbanded. This is not true, Lopatcong Township Rescue Squad withdrew recently from this force, but still three squads remain; including squads from Bloomsbury and Greenwich and Franklin Township. Mayor Butler questioned the use of our fire department for extrication in lieu of calling outside companies since they have the necessary tools, the same training and EMTs. Chief Chiu advised that the fire company's EMTs do not ride her rigs and prior to extricating a patient you have to have EMTs on scene and an ambulance. The rescue squad, during the day, is hurting for manpower and sometimes can't even get an ambulance out, the fire department is willing to assist the squad with extrication, not to take this over. Mayor Butler is concerned that waiting for outside resources to respond to an extrication call valuable time is wasted. The squad used to drill with the fire department a long time ago, but no longer do this. Mayor Butler questioned as to who has the authority to delegate the task force to come into our town for extrication calls; Chief Chiu makes that determination. EMTs whether they belong to the fire department or to the rescue squad, they all are certified under the NFPA standards and receive the same training as with extrication. Mayor Butler and Committeeman Pence will attend the next squad meeting to address the squad as to the committee's consensus to utilize resources from within our own township for extrication and if needed then the task force should be called.

OEM REPORT – Raymond Read

Mr. Read advised the committee that our EOP (Emergency Operations Plan) has been approved by the State. A Generator Grant of \$150,000 applying for two generators, DPW and Municipal Building, has been accepted awaiting approval. Most MVR's have been received and on file. Attended a Risk

Management and Behavioral Health Classes. Ready to close out Hurricane Sandy. Roast Beef dinner in May.
